
Guided by our commitment to fostering cultural exchange, creativity and dialogue through the arts, this season united local and international communities within our spaces.


April 16 – April 28, 2025






















CAP Bookshop

We invite our guests to explore our selection of books covering diverse fields such as architecture, fashion, art, lifestyle, photography, travel, children's books, cooking, design and more.








CAP Library
